6. **Rev. Erie Prince** 1797-1862 *Settler, Church Elder, School Inspector, Superintendent, Donated land for Cascade Cemetery*

7. **George W. Gorham** 1831-1919 *Township Clerk, Treasurer*

8. **Edgar R. Johnson** 1832-1913 *Settler, Teacher, Township Supervisor, Clerk, Superintendent*

9. **Gideon Denison** 1802-1873 *Pioneer Family, Died in Sinking of The Ironsides*

10. **Henry Clay Denison** 1834-1905 *Pioneer, Farmer, Kept Journal of Pioneer Life, Township Supervisor, Clerk, School Inspector, School Superintendent, Justice of the Peace*

11. **Frances E. Campau** 1850-1933 *Daughter of Grand Rapids Founder, Toussaint Campau, Wife of Dr. Danforth*

12. **Dr. Mortimer W. Danforth** 1842-1895 *Settler, Civil War Veteran, Prisoner Andersonville, Physician*

13. **John M. Patterson** 1847-1927 *Pioneer Family, Civil War Veteran*

14. **Veterans Memorial**

15. **Charles F. Holt** 1844-1924 *Civil War Veteran, Founder of Cascade Magnetic Mineral Springs Hotel, Farmer*

16. **Hugh B. Brown** 1829-1905 *Pioneer Family, Justice of the Peace, Officiated over Brockaway Murder Trial*

20. **Peter Teeple** 1797-1878 *Pioneer, First Township Supervisor, Son, Seneca was Civil War Veteran - Wilderness and Appomattox*

21. **Elizabeth Cook & Lewis Cook** 1801-1871 *Early Settlers, Built first house in Cascade on what is now 28<sup>th</sup> Street, Cook (Teeple) Cemetery on Cook farm moved to Cascade Cemetery in 1966*

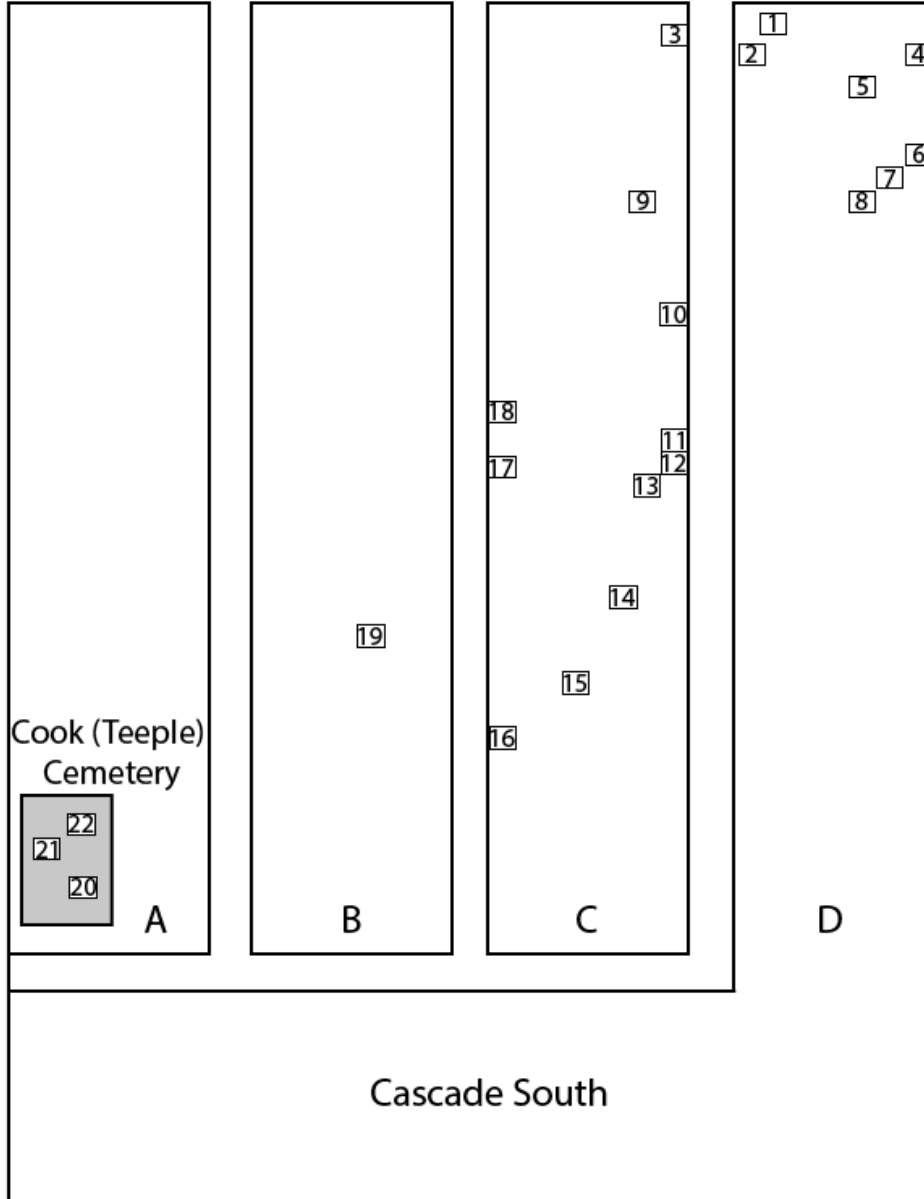
